Hi there church,

Death has been defeated because Jesus Christ is risen! This is the great Easter proclamation, and one I celebrate with you and all the faithful this holy season. It is especially poignant for my family as we grieve the loss of a mother, wife, and nana, and at the same time rejoice that she rests in the care and presence of her God and Savior, and she is one with the great cloud of witnesses. There has been and will be much grief, but I have been astonished that equal to the grief is thankfulness and rejoicing. This is, I believe, because we believe in the resurrec-

tion of the dead, and the life of the world to come.

This faith in the future that rests in God's hands has been won by Christ the Victor (Christus Victor), the title of an atonement theory long held by the early and pre-Middle Ages church. In America, the predominant atonement theory has been what's called "penal substitution," Christ's death on the cross is a legal offering that satisfies a God who cannot be unjust in forgiveness. On the other hand in Christus Victor atonement theory, Christ's death is a decisive victory in the war against death and evil by what amounts to a contractual loophole wherein the Devil loses power over humanity because the Evil One puts the New Human (Jesus) to death, and Jesus then destroys death, the only stranglehold evil had. The devil gets pranked, and the Godhead reconciles with the world.

Whatever kind of atonement theory a church body or an individual may subscribe to, the truth remains that Jesus' resurrection flips the story around, and opens a road never before travelled. The faithful dare to believe that even if tomorrow never comes, tomorrow will surely come. Such boldness in faith and proclamation means an undermining of what makes us afraid, angry, and sick. And that means we're free, free to live as God intends us to live: wondering at life, striving for justice and kindness, and not shying away from truth.

Christ is risen! Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia!


