Hi there church,

Throughout the building, you'll see framed words of the promises made at baptisms and confirmations. Parents, guardians, and sponsors make promises on behalf of children at infant or child baptisms, and candidates themselves make their own promises at adult baptisms or confirmations. These promises are rooted in ancient liturgies that have always been connected to the sacrament of baptism and the baptized life.

- -to live among God's faithful people.
- -to hear the Word of God and share in the Lord's Supper
- -to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed
- -to serve all people, following the example of Jesus
- -to strive for justice and peace in all the earth

To live, hear, share, proclaim, serve, and strive. As the council reflects on our core values as a congregation, and on a focused mission statement, a daring vision, and more specific goals, I pause to reflect on these promises we make as individuals and families. I hadn't really ever thought about my own personal mission statement, daring vision, and more specific goals, but these promises are a good start for me, and probably for you too.

On Pentecost, our confirmands will make those promises for themselves. I encourage each of you to hold those promises close for yourself as well. It might even be a good idea to let confirmands know that their promises inspire your own and remind you that you are continually called to live out those promises too. When we can inspire one another, the Holy Spirit has a real chance of making things happen.

May we all make those promises together on Pentecost.

OPEN HANDS

Liturgical scholar Balthasar Fischer (1912-2001) shared an "a-ha" realization about the significance of praying with open, outstretched hands, an ancient practice. The opposite gesture, a closed fist, is used to threaten others or even inflict violence. We also grasp things in closed fists, refusing to let go, to share, to hold gently or loosely.

When we pray with open hands, Fischer explained, we're saying before God that we renounce "all highhandedness, all pride in [our] own sufficiency, all violence." We hold up our empty hands to God, saying, "I have nothing that I have not received from you, nothing that you have not placed in my empty hands. Therefore I do not keep a frantic hold on anything you have given me; therefore, too, I desire not to strike and hurt but only to give and to spread happiness and joy."

We have booked the dates for next year's beach retreat so hold the dates – February 7-9, 2025. More information will be coming later in the year.


Due to scheduling conflicts, WELCA activities will not be held in May. Please note the June dates for each meeting.


