Hi there church,

There has seemed to be a running theme in my sermons the last few months or so. Maybe you've noticed, but I feel like I've been repeating something along the lines of: God's kingdom is so different from our human way of operating.

Through the parables and ministry of Jesus, in the last few months, we've been exploring how the kingdom of God differs from human economy, wealth, power, and mercy.

Whether it's a parable that Jesus teaches or an action of Jesus ministry for someone else, Something about the kingdom of God is revealed to be something completely different than our human instinct.

Underneath a lot of Lutheran theology is a foundational theological claim called the "theology of the cross." Just a few months after Luther posted the 95 theses on the Wittenberg Church door, his Augustinian monastic order invited him to lay the theological groundwork of the claims he made about indulgences. This friendly disputation happened in Heidelberg Germany. And so is titled the Heidelberg Disputations. Quite a few of the points that Luther debated had to do with what he called the "theology of the cross."

In short, the theology of the cross means that while the rest of the world thinks that God is more revealed in success, large numbers, or displays of might and power, the true revelation of God is made known in the things that we overlook or even dismiss. Namely God is revealed in suffering, failure, and loss.

It's a theology that allows for the mystery of God to continue as a mystery while also allowing God to continue to work real goodness, righteousness, justice, and mercy, even when we cannot see it. There is even a disputation point that Luther makes in Heidelberg, which says the work of theology is not to figure out where God is in human events that have already transpired.

For non-theology nerds, it really just translates to this: God tirelessly works for the good and never abandons victims, the oppressed, the hurting, or the least. In fact, through Jesus' cross, God remains closest to them, and is even mysteriously revealed more fully through such things.

A blessed month of Reformation celebration to you all. Keep your eyes open for those hidden ways in which God continues to work for all good


