Hi there church.

The prophet Isaiah's opening vision this season of Advent contains images of what many of us yearn for in the kingdom of heaven. All nations and peoples stream to learn the ways of God, which is put in stark contrast with the ways of war. People beat their weapons into tillers and plows. And all of it is done in

some wonderful community. Individuals don't say, "I am going to the mountain of the LORD." They say, "Let us go to the mountain of the LORD." People stream to the highest mountain to "study war no more," like the old African spiritual says.

I wonder what that class is like. I wonder what apprenticeships they take up, or what field study they participate in. What is lab time like? What are the tests like? The great matriculation of students to the great and final course on peace, I imagine to myself when hearing these words of Isaiah.

This Advent, how might we study peace? What course would you teach? What field study for peace might be practiced in the grocery store, at school, at the work site, at the table, or on a walk? What could you recite or put to music as you give of your time and treasures this season to the people you love, and even some that you don't love as well? What weapon of yours should be beaten down and remade into a life-giving instrument?

We're students, dear church, always. Let us go to the mountain of the LORD and take God's great course.


